

The *Can It!* book is one of the Start-to-Finish Literacy books available from Don Johnston (<http://www.donjohnston.com/>). Each set includes three different books linked to an age-appropriate book. *Can It!* is part of a series on “Recycling – Cash in the Trash.”

This collection of photos shows how each page of the book was adapted to **objects**.

In addition to having objects on various pages, we recommend having additional copies of the object symbols for the students to use to communicate their responses to comprehension questions.

The object symbols can also be used in the visual mapping or cloze procedures for addressing comprehension before, during, and after reading.

You can, too.



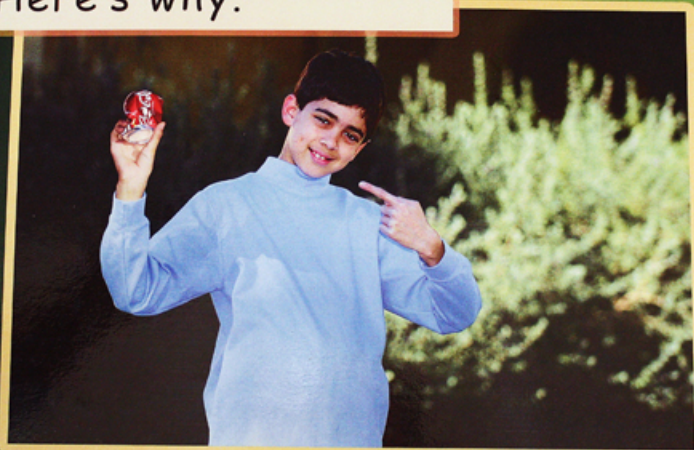


Do you like Coke?

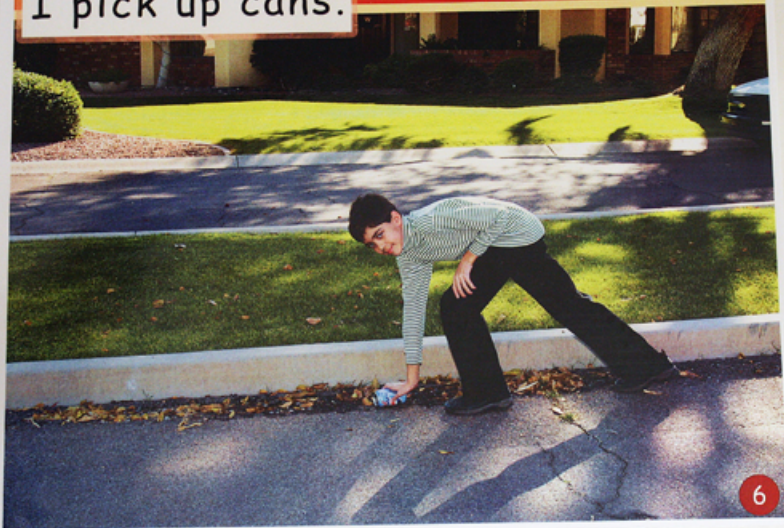


I don't.

about it.

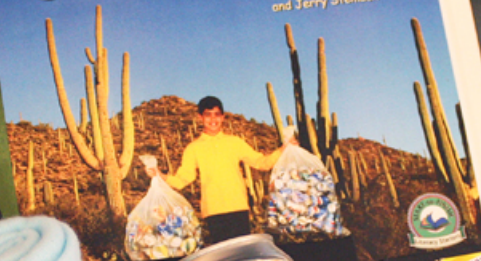
